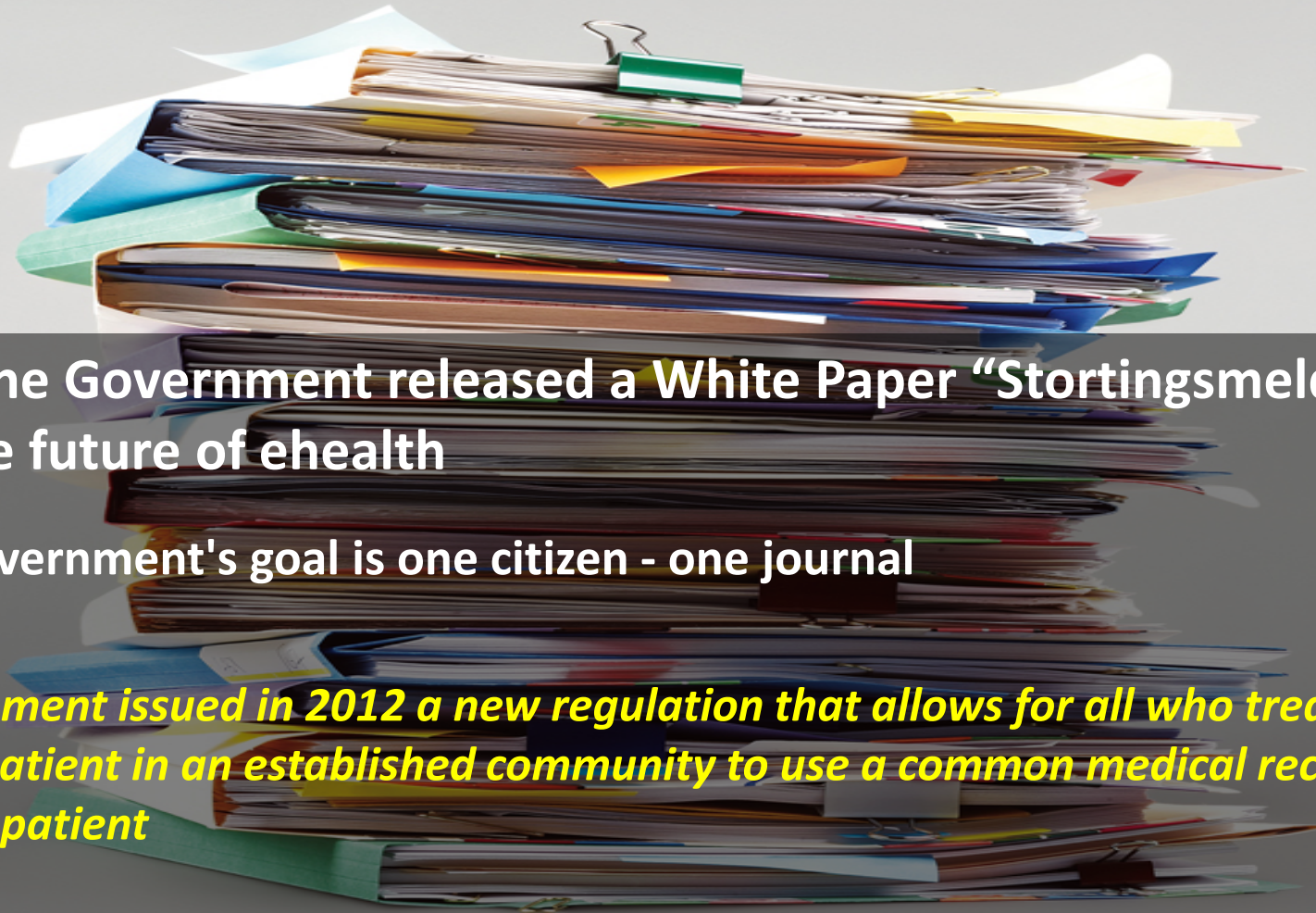


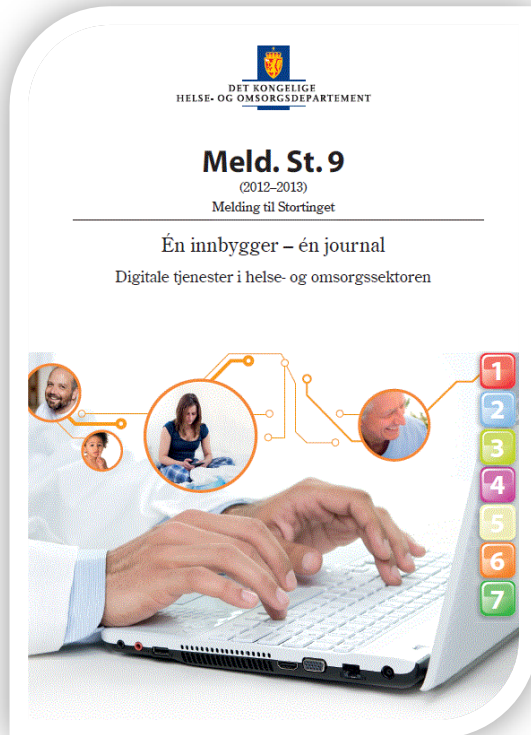
# White Paper: One citizen - One record



- In 2012 the Government released a White Paper “Stortingsmelding” about the future of ehealth
  - The government's goal is one citizen - one journal
  - *Government issued in 2012 a new regulation that allows for all who treat the same patient in an established community to use a common medical record for the patient*

# “One citizen - One record”

**How can « One citizen – One record» be realized in order to make updated EHR information available for the patient and health workers throughout the process of care?**



- **Includes both health- and care sector**
- **Different alternatives/architectures should be considered**
- **Risk, management challenges and organizational consequences will be evaluated for all alternatives**

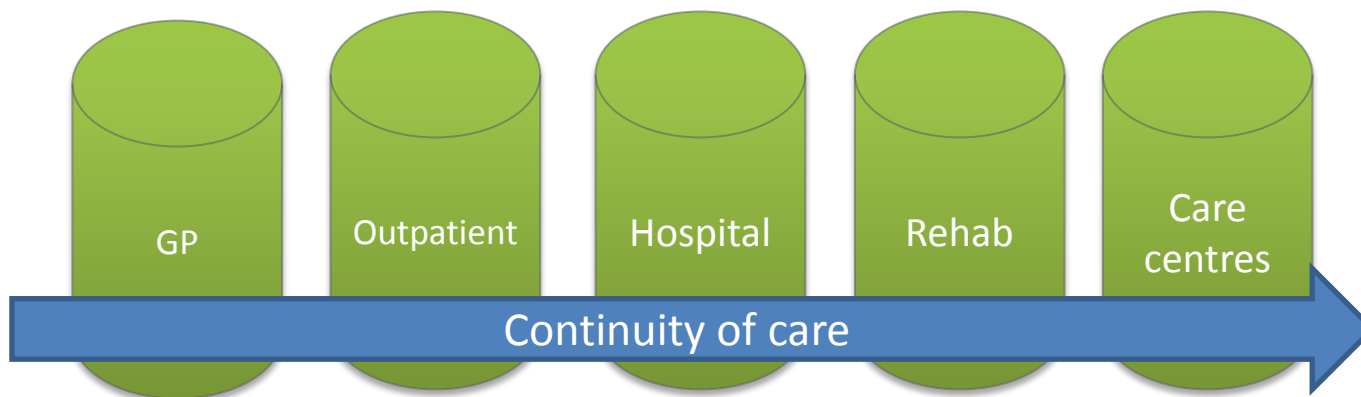
